	<p><b>Energy Efficiency Watch - Background</b></p> <p>In September 2007 the Energy Efficiency Watch (EEW), following a Parliamentary call and coordinated by EUFORES, was officially launched. The project monitors and highlights best policy practice of political and legislative measures, instruments and activities in the field of energy efficiency within the framework of the "National Energy Efficiency Action Plans" (NEEAPs). In a second step it will inform about the results and offer advice on the drafting and implementation of the NEEAPs.</p>
	<p><b>Latest news regarding the NEEAPs</b></p> <p>The Energy Efficiency and Energy Service Directive (ESD) requires Member States to achieve a reduction target in end-energy use of 9% by 2016, and therefore to submit three National Energy Efficiency Action Plans (NEEAPs) to show on how they are planning to reach that goal. The first NEEAP was due by June 30, 2007.</p> <p>The European Commission published its first assessment report of all National Energy Efficiency Action Plans (NEEAP) that were available until December 2007 (17 in total). Although the Action Plans provide some encouragement, there appears to be a gap between the political commitment to energy efficiency and the proposals aimed at facing up to these challenges.</p> <p>On October 2007, the Commission launched Infringement Procedures for the remaining Member States for their failure to notify the first NEEAP. Up to today almost all Member State have submitted an action plan.</p> <p>Please find the related EC documents at:</p> <p><a href="http://ec.europa.eu/energy/climate_actions/index_en.htm">http://ec.europa.eu/energy/climate_actions/index_en.htm</a></p> <p>The European Commission is conducting an analysis right now on whether the NEEAPs fulfil the requirements of the ESD Directive.</p>

## **Energy Efficiency Watch – Evaluation**

### **First results**

Within the Energy Efficiency Watch project, Wuppertal Institute and Ecofys carried out a screening of all available plans. This evaluation is complementary to the EC evaluation.

The overall impression of the first screening is that the issue of energy efficiency is not taken seriously enough. The screening identified very heterogeneous designs, contents and levels of information provided. In most cases, the relationship between technical energy saving potentials, energy saving targets and energy efficiency improvement measures, is weak or not transparent.

Nevertheless, a very illustrative and impressive collection of measures exists that enables international mutual learning.

The collection of measures broadens thinking about energy efficiency from isolated measures to coherent policy packages. But what is needed now is a harmonisation of the NEEAPs and the evaluation methods.

### **Energy Efficiency Watch - Schedule**

In several meetings the five Managing Partner of the EEW (EUFORES, ECOFYS, the Wuppertal Institute, the Upper-Austria Energy Agency (ESV), and the European Council for an Energy Efficient Economy (ECEEE)), have discussed the NEEAPs together with external partners from industry and civil society in order to create a stakeholders contribution and feedback group that covers as many sectors of energy efficiency as possible.

During the Inter-Parliamentary Meeting at the Sustainable Energy Week in Brussels, first results of the screening had been presented. ([See IPM@EUSEW2008](#))

Now that the first screening is done, Wuppertal Institute and Ecofys will in a second phase evaluate 12 of the NEEAPs in-depth to find out best policy practices that then can be communicated all over Europe as advice for the second round of NEEAPs in 2011. The in-depth evaluation will be finished by the end of July. The results will then be distributed all over Europe with a special focus on 6 parliamentary events. The first one is planned to be held in Budapest, Hungary early November 2008.
