Energy Efficiency Watch - Background

In September 2007 the Energy Efficiency Watch (EEW), following a Parliamentary call and coordinated by EUFORES, was officially launched. The project monitors and highlights good policy practice of political and legislative measures, instruments and activities in the field of energy efficiency within the framework of the “National Energy Efficiency Action Plans” (NEEAPs). In a second step it will inform about the results and offer advice on the drafting and implementation of the NEEAPs.

Energy Efficiency – Policy Update

Since all EU Member States submitted their first National Energy Efficiency Action Plan, now the implementation of all measures announced in the NEEAPs is the key for the success of national policies. Furthermore, an enduring process of updating and strengthening the measures is needed in order to stimulate permanent innovation in a more energy efficient society.

The Commission is committed to providing support to Member States on implementation and also facilitating further development and improvement of the NEEAPs. A **Concerted Action on the Energy Services Directive (CA ESD)**, funded by the Intelligent Energy Europe Programme (IEE), has been established in June 2008 as a Member State platform for exchange of experiences and good practices. One of its five core themes focuses on the NEEAPs and how to improve them and establish their strategic role in the future. The CA ESD will run until

June 2011 and more information is available at its website: www.esd-ca.eu. The Commission also provides support to Member States via different IEE projects, as pointed out by Pirjo-Liisa Koskimäki (Head of Energy Efficiency Unit, DG TREN) during an interview with EurActiv (www.euractiv.com).

The EEW can play an important role in this process as well.

The goal of the **EEW project** is to ensure ambitious NEEAPs in all EU Member States. Therefore with its publication the EEW is offering advice on good practices of energy efficiency policies to enable an international mutual learning process.

The existing gap in several NEEAPs between the political commitment on energy efficiency on one side, and the strategies and measures presented in the plans, needs to be minimised. This shall be the basis for stronger plans and keen commitments in the second round of NEEAPs in 2011.

Another major step for a more energy efficient Europe is the currently ongoing **re-cast of the energy performance of buildings directive (EPBD)**. EUFORES – as Parliamentary Network - is strongly involved in that process. The EEW project supports these activities with substantial information, a strong network of experts and with scientific expertise.

EEW Brochure and Report

The screening of all NEEAP as well as the in-depth analysis of 12 selected plans is finished. Those selected NEEAPs were from: Belgium, Bulgaria, Czech Republic, France, Germany, Hungary, Italy, Poland, Romania, Spain, Sweden, and the United Kingdom.

“Promoting Energy Efficiency in Europe” - The EEW Brochure is available now!

The 16-pages EEW Brochure presents the **evaluation results** in a **condensed** way. It shows good practice examples in the transport and public sector, shows the advantages of financial incentives, market-based approaches, voluntary agreements, the dynamisation of standards and others.

The report, based on the screening working paper already available online, will serve as an information source for readers who would like to know more about the various NEEAPs in detail.

EEW Schedule

The EEW Brochure and Report will be distributed all over Europe with a special focus on Parliamentary events.

The first one took place within **EUFORES' 8th Inter-Parliamentary Meeting in Budapest**, Hungary November 2008.

The IPM8 gathered more than 60 Members of the European Parliament and of National Parliaments from 19 EU Member States. Furthermore, high-level civil servants from the European Commission, selected representatives from industry

and the NGO-sector attended. In the adopted Declaration of Budapest the attending Parliamentarians urged Member States to implement, monitor and improve energy efficiency measures listed in their respective NEEAPs as well as work on the improvement of the second round of national Energy Efficiency Action Plans. Over the year 2009 **additional Parliamentary events** are planned in **Spain, Poland, the United Kingdom and Belgium**.

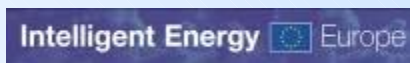
